She expanded the program to Liberia, West Africa where Ann leads teams of Americans and Liberians across Liberia where she trains leaders how to hold prison and community Family Days, as well as start educational programs.

Ann also founded an educational empowerment/support group for the entire family that built Search Institute's 40 Developmental Assets© and offered support and education for children, parents/caregivers, and returning citizens. Under her leadership, the program won the prestigious American Probation and Parole Association's *National Award of Excellence in Crime Prevention, NM Innovative Behavioral Health Program Star*, one of the top 10 Behavioral Health programs in NM, and is recognized as a National and State Best Practice Model. Ann's book, *Strengthening Families from the Inside Out –Leader's Guidebook #1*, helps congregations, corrections departments, and organizations around the world start programs for families of prisoners and returning citizens.

In 2023 Ann resigned from that ministry and has recently founded **Family Connections Ministry**, and is involved with her local church, on several Boards, helping other non-profits, leading workshops as requested, and continuing her prison ministry in various states.
